The 2015 Barbaresco Montaribaldi is fabulous. Bright, fresh and beautifully delineated, the Montaribaldi is endowed with terrific energy that balances the natural richness of the year. Chalk, crushed rocks, orange peel and mint all add to a sensation of brightness that runs through the wine. The long, nuanced finish is nicely supported by beams of salinity. What a gorgeous wine this is.

The 2015 Barbaresco Rombone is potent and ample in the glass, with serious tannins lurking in the background. The Rombone is the most reticent of the Nada 2015 Barbarescos. Accordingly, it will also require a bit of time to be at its best. Dark red cherry, plum, kirsch, menthol, new leather and exotic spice notes build into the explosive, searing finish.

The 2015 Barbaresco Manzola is beautifully lifted and gracious in the glass. Rose petal, sweet red cherry, mint, wild flowers and cinnamon are nicely woven together in this very pretty and expressive Barbaresco. As was the case last year, my impression is that the heat of 2015 helped produce a flashy, racy Barbaresco with relatively soft contours that will drink well with minimal cellaring. The 2015 is such an attractive wine.

Drinking window: 2020 - 2030

Super-expressive today, the 2015 Seifile is wonderfully dense and pliant, yet also retains a mid-weight sense of structure that avoids the superconcentrated style of years past. A move towards more neutral oak lets the fruit really come through nicely. Even so, the 2015 is quite reticent, which is probably a good thing for its long-term prospects. Red cherry jam and pomegranate fruit are front and center, with hints of spice, lavender and menthol that add fragrance.
