Deceptively medium in body, Nada's 2016 Dolcetto d'Alba packs a real punch, with tons of dark, varietal fruit and considerable tannic clout. Most of the fruit emerges from a parcel in Rombone that could be planted to Nebbiolo. Blue and purplish-hued berries, lavender and exotic spice notes are nicely pushed forward in this super-expressive Dolcetto. I tasted the 2016 from tank just prior to bottling.

The 2015 Langhe Nebbiolo is done with shortish fermentations that bring out distinctly floral, red-toned flavors and the more feminine side of Nebbiolo. Sweet red cherry, raspberry, rose petal, and mint are nicely woven together in a pretty, gracious Langhe Nebbiolo to drink now and over the next handful of years. There is a lot to like. The Langhe Nebbiolo was aged in a combination of cask and neutral French oak.
